News is spreading rapidly and so we found it important to provide our clients with results quickly. The survey has been open for 6 days and received 73 responses from UK members in this short duration; highlighting the strength of the mid-market M&A community. 


#1 Consequences for day to day work

Almost all of our respondents work entirely from home

Question 2 Are you still physically visiting clients and/or prospects?




Physical meetings with clients have completely stopped




#2 Consequences for the market and project portfolio

Question 3 What percentage of current deal processes have been put ON HOLD in the last two weeks?




- Almost one third of the respondents answered that all of their sell-side projects were being put on hold
- More than one third of the respondents answered that all of their buy-side projects were being put on hold
- One fourth of the respondents did not have any due dilligence projects being put on hold

Question 4 What percentage of current deal processes have been terminated in the last two weeks?




 At more than 2 out of 3 firms, no buy-side or sell-side projects have been cancelled yet

Question 5 Did you obtain any new assignments?




Two thirds of the respondents have not received any incoming projects

Two thirds of the respondents noticed a change in behaviour of lenders

Question 7 If you answered "Yes" at the previous question: What kind of change do you see in the attitude of financiers?




About 3 out of 4 respondents notice that lenders have been holding back, waiting or dismissive with new loan applications




#3 Expectations for the upcoming months

Question 8 The market is unstable at the moment. How many months do you think it will take for the market to stabilize?




Over 4 out of 5 respondents think the M&A market will recover within 6 months

Question 9 How many months do you think it will take for the M&A market returns to pre corona virus levels?




Less than 1 out of 5 respondents expects that it will take more than a year before the market returns to pre-corona levels

Question 10 What difference do you expect in the next three months in regards to new assignments?



- Over half of the respondents expects a decrease of at least 50% in the number of new sell side projects
- More than 1 in 3 respondents answered that they expect no negative impact on new buy-side projects
- One fourth of the respondents expect an increase in valuation projects
- Half of the respondents expect an increase in financing projects
- Over 4 out of 5 respondents expect an increase in corporate recovery projects

Ouestion 11 How much work (expressed as a percentage) will your firm lose in the next 3 months as a result of the corona virus?



Almost two thirds of the respondents expect a decrease in work of at least 25%



#4 Opportunities in times of corona crisis

- 1 Increase in the number of corporate recovery, restructuring and (re-)financing cases
- 2 Falling prices offer opportunities for buy side parties that have sufficient cash
- 3 On the sell-side there will be a rise in opportunities for accelerated and distressed M&A
- 4 Increased demand for companies in particular sectors, such as pharmaceuticals, video conferencing, home gyms, will increase
- 5 Private markets may benefit from fear and underperformance in public markets
- 6 There will be consolidations throughout the economy where companies with strong balance sheets and stable earnings are likely to gain market share
- 7 Increase in independent business reviews and focus on strategic M&A advisory work
- **8** Value expectations on the sell side become more realistic, which improves the chance of success per transaction and the transaction speed
- 9 Shifting focus from the importance of transaction structure to added value
- 10 Companies will adjust their strategy; This can lead to new and different acquisition intentions
